Economy return air ticket	SPC will meet the costs of return airfare by the most economical and direct route. All funded participants should receive their return e-tickets before the 07 June 2023. Please contact Mrs.Sinalaulii Fifita immediately if have not received your ticket after date mentioned above. <u>Keep your boarding passes safely</u> as SPC will collect all boarding passes (Home Station to Nuku'alofa) to confirm the daily subsistence allowance/per diem given.			
Visa	Nationals of the following countries are NOT required to obtain visa before entering Tonga as visitors <u>https://www.revenue.gov.to/immigration-and-general-services</u> however, they need to ensure that a passport that is valid for at least 6 months from date of entry into Tonga. Countries who are not on exemption list will need to ensure that visa is acquired prior to travel dates.			







Immigration	 Entry Once you have arrived at the Immigration Check Point, please make sure you have all the necessary travel documents when you go through Passport Control ("Non-Residents" line). Immigration Officer will stamp your entry in your passport and please proceed to baggage belt. Please ensure that you have fulfilled the following requirements: ✓ Passport valid for at least six months on arrival. ✓ Funds necessary for a stay. Hotel confirmation letter can be presented to the officer. (Maintain a printed copy of Circular invite and Agenda) ✓ Valid travel documents for a return journey, and copy air ticket Departure Please make sure you have all the necessary travel documents and get an exit stamp in your passport by an Immigration Officer when you go through Passport Control.
Accommodation	Participants will be responsible for all their hotel bills and SPC will not be responsible for any of the costs. SPC would be happy to assist with accommodation bookings.
Meals	 Two refreshments (morning tea & lunch) for workshop days (12 – 14 June 2023) will be provided. Two refreshments (morning & afternoon tea) and lunch for workshop days (15 – 16 June 2023) will be provided.
Daily subsistence allowance/ Per diem (Funded Participants)	A daily subsistence allowance (DSA) will be provided to all funded participants. DSA will cover accommodation, incidentals, and meals. While we are doing our best to get DSAs transferred directly to participants' bank accounts, delays may be experienced. Participants are kindly asked to consider paying their costs until the receipt of their DSAs into their accounts. Transit days (if any): In case of transits, participants are expected to come prepared to cover the cost of transits. Transits cost for funded participants will be included in the itinerary provided. IMPORTANT All boarding passes from home station to Tonga are required to be submitted prior to collecting the, DSA for funded participants. Scanned copies of boarding passes for the return sectors are required to be emailed to Sinalaulii Fifita (<u>sinalauliif@spc.int</u>) upon completion of travel.
